The office of Traffic Safety invites you to apply for a special grant opportunity. These grant funds can be used for education, infrastructure, and enhancing community engagement as it pertains to the Vulnerable Road User population. A Vulnerable Road User (VRU) is defined as those individuals who are more at risk for serious injury or death if they are involved in a traffic crash, including (but are not limited to) pedestrians, bicyclists, scooters, and other micromobility device users.

Projects and programs that introduce innovative ideas or best practices with measurable outcomes are encouraged to apply, as are programs that foster collaboration amongst community resources. New partnerships and organizations that work with underserved or at-risk communities are encouraged to apply.

The Nevada Office of Traffic Safety is looking for community-based groups to promote safe mobility options. Projects and programs may include but are not limited to:
